Youth Pathways is an Australian Government initiative that assists young people aged 13 to 19 who are **‘most at risk’** of not making a successful transition to reach their full potential by keeping them engaged or re-engaging them with education or training.

Please fax this form to the appropriate number listed below on behalf of the young person requiring intensive case management. Jobs West will then follow up the young person to assist in identifying their needs and barriers to a successful transition through school to completion of year 12 (or its vocational equivalent) and ultimately to further education, training or employment.

Young people who only lack knowledge of career, training, education or employment options are not considered eligible for Youth Pathways.
